In general, any trees that have low growing/wide spreading crowns, are known to be subject to insect infestations, poorly formed growing habits, prone to disease, or bear fruit that are considered messy, odiferous, or have an inordinate amount of maintenance requirements, will be prohibited from planting on City properties.

### NOTES:

- All trees being considered for planting on commercial sites, Right of Ways, or other City Properties, must be approved by The City of Crestwood.
- This list is not intended to be all inclusive. The varieties are too numerous to list so tree approvals will be made on a case by case basis.
